Summary of Activities: 2024 in Review

In 2024, The Zahra Trust significantly expanded its efforts, making a meaningful impact on vulnerable communities worldwide. Our activities, rooted in compassion and sustainability, focused on addressing immediate needs, empowering individuals, and fostering long-term resilience.



Supporting Vulnerable Communities

Economic Empowerment: We introduced micro finance projects and vocational training programs to empower vulnerable women and individuals, helping them achieve financial independence and economic stability.

Education Initiatives: Recognising education as a tool to break the cycle of poverty, we supported formal and spiritual education by providing resources such as school fees, uniforms, and learning materials for under served

Healthcare Access: This year, we strengthened efforts to reduce mortality rates among women and improve healthcare for mothers and children through medical aid, camps, and maternal health programs.



Emergency Relief and Seasonal Aid

Conflict Response: During the crises in Gaza and Lebanon, we funded life-saving aid, including food, water, shelter, and medical support, to displaced families and those affected by conflict.

Winter Aid: We delivered essential supplies such as warm clothing, blankets, and food to remote and hard-to-reach areas, ensuring families were protected during the harsh winter months.

Ramadan Support: Under the theme "For a Sustainable Future," we provided daily iftar meals, food baskets, and launched development projects like olive tree planting, food gardens, and solar-powered water wells.

Muharram and Safar Campaigns: We supported vulnerable communities through water aid, food distribution, and spiritual development efforts, including

Humanitarian

The Zahra Trust is dedicated to providing comprehensive humanitarian aid to vulnerable communities across the globe. Our efforts span a range of critical areas, including the provision of food and water supplies, medical support, and emergency relief. We respond swiftly to crises, whether caused by natural disasters or community attacks, ensuring that those affected receive the help they need to survive and rebuild. Our commitment extends to long-term support through sustainable initiatives, empowering individuals and families to regain their independence and dignity. By addressing these essential needs, we strive to bring hope and relief to those facing hardship.





Orphans, Widows and Vulnerable

At The Zahra Trust, caring for vulnerable children, widows, and at-risk individuals is at the core of our mission. Through targeted initiatives, we ensure that these groups are not only supported in their immediate needs but are also empowered to thrive and build brighter futures.

Empowering Vulnerable Children

For vulnerable children, our priority is to provide life's essentials, from nutritious meals to access to education. We strive to ensure that financial barriers do not hinder their ability to pursue learning by providing school essentials and covering school fees. Beyond the classroom, we offer extracurricular activities and skills training to help children build confidence, develop talents, and create opportunities for their futures.

During times of celebration, such as Eid, we ensure these children are included in the joy by distributing gifts that foster a sense of belonging and happiness. These efforts not only address their material needs but also nurture their emotional well-being and sense of inclusion.

In 2024, 4,132 children benefitted from educational support, including remedial courses, school supplies, and access to extracurricular activities.

Empowering Widows

This year, we expanded our efforts to support widows through a range of initiatives designed to provide financial independence and a renewed sense of purpose. Our skills-based training programs include:

- Healthcare and Nursing Courses: Preparing widows for stable and rewarding careers.
- Horticultural and Beauty Training: Equipping them with skills to pursue opportunities in diverse industries.
- Small Business Support: Helping widows set up businesses, such as kiosks, to generate sustainable incomes and support their families.

Through these initiatives, **774 widows** gained the tools and resources to become self-sufficient, enabling them to care for their loved ones with dignity and confidence.



Providing Shelter and Support

Housing plays a crucial role in promoting stability and well-being. In 2024, we provided housing support to **79 beneficiaries**, ensuring vulnerable families and widows had access to safe and secure homes.

Seasonal Aid and Food Security

Our winter aid campaign reached 20,162 beneficiaries, providing winter essentials such as blankets, clothing, and heaters to displaced and impoverished families. Additionally, our food aid initiatives delivered essential supplies to 4,960 individuals, ensuring that vulnerable families had access to nutritious meals during challenging times.

Building Community and Connection

To combat isolation and foster a sense of belonging, we regularly organise events for widows, creating opportunities for them to connect with like-minded individuals and form supportive networks. These gatherings play a crucial role in strengthening emotional well-being and building resilience.

Looking Ahead

Our commitment to vulnerable children and widows remains steadfast. In the coming year, we aim to expand our programs further, focusing on providing additional educational support, enhancing skills training, and creating more opportunities for sustainable livelihoods. By empowering these individuals with resources, skills, and community support, we are paving the way for a future where they can thrive independently and contribute to their communities.

Through our comprehensive approach, The Zahra Trust is transforming lives, ensuring that vulnerable children and widows have the support they need to overcome challenges, embrace opportunities, and build brighter, more hopeful futures for themselves and their families.

How Winter Clothing Changed Kazim's Life in Skardu

Kazim, a young boy from Skardu, faced terrible loss in his life two years ago when he lost his father. His mother, now the sole provider, struggled to meet even the most basic needs for Kazim and his siblings. Food insecurity, inadequate shelter, and the lack of warm clothing during Skardu's biting winters loomed over their lives. With little assistance from relatives and limited support from local aid offices, their days were marked by hardship and uncertainty.

Winter added another layer of difficulty. Kazim often walked to his Quran classes in the early morning, braving the freezing cold with nothing more than a thin jacket, his small hands tucked under his arms for warmth. His mother's inability to afford proper winter clothing filled her with guilt and sorrow, as she watched her child shiver through the mornings.

A lifeline came through The Zahra Trust.
The winter clothing program aimed to provide essential warmth to vulnerable families. When Kazim's mother found out about our initiative, she felt a wave of relief. "I couldn't afford warm clothing for Kazim this winter and felt ashamed," she shared. "When I learned about the program, I was overwhelmed with happiness."

The impact of this small yet significant intervention rippled through the family's life. Kazim could now focus on his studies without the distraction of freezing temperatures. The family experienced a revitalised sense of hope, strengthened by the support provided by the Trust. His mother's words echoed this transformation: "Kazim no longer worries about the cold. He can focus on learning with confidence and comfort."

Kazim's story is a poignant reminder of the challenges faced by orphans and vulnerable families in Afghanistan's harsh winters. It also highlights the profound difference that timely and thoughtful assistance can make.



Food & Water Aid

The Zahra Trust is committed to ensuring that vulnerable communities have access to essential food and clean water resources year-round. By addressing immediate needs and providing sustainable solutions, we empower individuals and families to overcome challenges with dignity and resilience.

Food Aid: Empowering Families

One of our primary initiatives is the distribution of food staples, such as rice, flour, lentils, and oil, often provided as monthly supplies. These essentials give beneficiaries the autonomy to prepare meals according to their own preferences and cultural traditions, fostering a sense of independence during difficult times.

In addition to staples, we provide warm, nutritious meals to communities in need, particularly during seasonal periods like Ramadan and winter. Families are welcomed into safe and supportive environments to enjoy three-course meals that nourish both body and spirit, creating a sense of community and dignity.


Clean Water Solutions: A Lifeline for Communities

Access to clean water is fundamental to health and survival. In the Haidariya area of Iraq, we have established a clean water filtration system that provides safe drinking water to the surrounding neighbourhoods and supports female-led households in our orphan village.

Beyond Iraq, our clean water initiatives include filtration systems, water wells, and sustainable desalination solutions, ensuring life-saving water access for vulnerable communities.

Nidhal's story: One of unwavering resilience

Nidhal's story is one of unwavering resilience in the face of overwhelming challenges. At 60 years old, this widow from Najaf, Iraq, has endured profound losses. First, she lost her husband, then her son and daughter-in-law in tragic succession, leaving her as the sole caregiver for her seven daughters and a grandson. Two of her daughters endure serious medical challenges—one battling a brain tumor and the other dealing with a brain artery issue—adding to the difficulties she confronts each day. Food insecurity became a constant source of stress, as Nidhal worked tirelessly to provide for her family with very limited resources.

Life seemed insurmountable, but hope arrived in the form of The Zahra Trust. Recognising the dire circumstances of Nidhal and her family, the Trust began providing food aid, delivering parcels of essential items to ease her burden. These food parcels became a lifeline, ensuring that Nidhal could put nutritious meals on the table for her family.

Distributed regularly, particularly during the holy month of Ramadan, the parcels not only alleviated hunger but also offered Nidhal a sense of relief and support during her most difficult moments.

Health & Medical Aid

At The Zahra Trust, we are dedicated to providing critical health and medical aid to vulnerable individuals facing serious challenges. Throughout the year, we assess individual cases carefully, offering support for life-saving and life-changing surgeries and treatments that would otherwise be unattainable due to financial hardship. Our commitment ensures that those in need receive the care they desperately require, alleviating suffering and transforming lives.

Comprehensive Medical Support

This year, we saw a significant increase in one-off medical cases requiring urgent intervention. From life-saving surgeries to essential medical treatments, we provided tailored support to individuals who had no other means of accessing the care they needed. We also provided urgent medical care to victims of violence resulting from attacks on communities, supporting those injured with life-saving treatments, recovery assistance, and ongoing medical support to help them rebuild their lives.

Additionally, following the emergency in Lebanon, we extended our medical aid to focus on the mental health of children affected by the crisis. Many children suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) received psychological support and treatment, helping them to begin the process of healing and recovery. These efforts underscore our holistic approach to health, addressing both physical and mental well-being.



2024 Achievements

In 2024, The Zahra Trust provided critical medical aid to 22,600 beneficiaries, addressing urgent health needs through:

Saving Fatemeh: The power of timely support

The impact of compassion and quality medical assistance has changed the lives of 17-year-old Fatemeh and her family. Previously weighed down by a heartbreaking diagnosis and significant financial struggles, they now find themselves filled with hope and resilience, all due to the timely support from The Zahra Trust.

Fatemeh's journey began in February 2024 when she was diagnosed with a large malignant tumor in her pelvis and left ovary weighing approximately five kilograms. Surgery was swiftly scheduled, and even before it, fluid was drained from her lungs to relieve pressure caused by the illness. Subsequent tests confirmed the malignancy, and another tumor was discovered in her lung. This news might have crushed a family already on the brink, but it marked the start of a remarkable journey of resilience.

The illness quickly escalated, requiring urgent surgery and intensive chemotherapy. Without medical insurance and struggling to make ends meet, her family faced mounting debts, with her father selling his modest street vending business to cover initial costs. Despite these hardships, the Safdari family found hope.

The Zahra Trust stepped in with critical medical aid and financial support that not only alleviated their immediate burdens but also transformed Fatemeh's chances of recovery.

The trust's assistance comprised assistance with the family's debts, funding Fatemeh's chemotherapy sessions, and provided essential support for transportation, nutrition, and follow-up care. Each chemotherapy round, was fully sponsored, ensuring uninterrupted treatment. By May 2024, tests showed significant improvement in her lung functionality and continued progress in fighting the disease, giving her family renewed optimism.

Beyond financial relief, the charity's ongoing engagement—through personal visits and regular follow-ups—provided the Safdari family with emotional strength and stability. Fatemeh's father shared, "We were overwhelmed, but the charity gave us hope and a path forward. Fatemeh is improving, and we now believe in a brighter future."

Fatemeh's journey to recovery highlights the profound effects of medical assistance. As her treatments continue to succeed, she is steadily regaining her strength, and her family's optimism is revitalised. Their experience emphasises that timely and compassionate care can not only save lives but also restore dignity and hope for those who require it.



Emergency Aid

As conflict and natural disasters continue to devastate lives across the globe, The Zahra Trust remains unwavering in its mission to provide life-saving support to those in desperate need. Often the first—and sometimes the only—Shia charity on the ground, our dedicated teams deliver critical aid to vulnerable communities who are often overlooked by larger relief efforts.

Our trained field teams respond swiftly to emergencies, ensuring that essential resources such as food, water, medical supplies, and shelter reach affected families as quickly as possible. This rapid response capability has allowed us to be a lifeline for communities facing unimaginable hardships.

Responding to Global Crises

In the past year, we have extended critical support to regions experiencing profound crises:

Gaza:

Through trusted implementation partners, we have delivered aid to children and families, focusing on clean water, medical supplies, and food aid. These efforts address the basic needs of a population enduring immense hardship under prolonged conflict and blockade.

Yemen:

During the recent floods, we provided emergency relief, including food supplies, potable water, tents, mattresses, and blankets. Throughout the year, our work in Yemen continues, offering life-saving assistance to families facing famine, conflict, and displacement.

Afghanistan and Pakistan:

Marginalised Shia communities affected by sectarian violence received vital support, including financial aid for families of martyrs, urgent care for the wounded, and other essential assistance. These efforts help individuals rebuild their lives and bring much-needed relief to those left vulnerable by ongoing violence.

Lebanon:

Initially supporting refugees displaced by conflict, we are now helping families who have returned to find their homes destroyed. Our efforts include aiding reconstruction, providing shelter, and ensuring families can regain stability.


Looking Ahead

The Khaldeh Relief Center went beyond mere assistance; it reinstated dignity, fostered resilience, and equipped the family with the strength to overcome their challenges. Marginalised Communities

The Zahra Trust stands unwavering in its commitment to supporting communities affected by targeted violence and tragedy. In the face of unimaginable hardship, we respond with compassion and urgency, delivering life-saving aid and standing in solidarity with marginalised groups who are often targeted because of their identity. Through emergency relief and long-term rehabilitation, we work tirelessly to restore hope and dignity to those in need.

Tragedies and Our Response in 2024

30th April 2024: Herat, Afghanistan

A brutal attack on a Shia mosque in Herat claimed the lives of six people, including the Imam and a three-year-old child, while injuring many others. The mosque, a sanctuary for worship and peace, was left devastated, plunging the community into grief.

24th July 2024: Parachinar, Pakistan

Ongoing violence in Parachinar has resulted in the deaths of 42 individuals, with over 164 injured. Families in the area face relentless attacks and dire conditions, requiring urgent relief.

At The Zahra Trust, our commitment to development work is focused on building stronger, more resilient communities through sustainable solutions. We strive to address the root causes of poverty by providing essential services and infrastructure. Our initiatives include installing clean water solutions, such as electric and solar-powered water wells, to ensure reliable access to safe drinking water. We also work on reconstructing and improving homes for vulnerable families, creating safer and more secure living conditions.

Education and skills training are central to our approach, offering a form of sadaqa jariya to help break the cycle of poverty. By equipping children and adults with the knowledge and skills they need, we promote financial independence and sustainability. Our microfinance project, which provides rickshaws to individuals, gives them a sense of ownership and responsibility over their livelihoods, as they contribute to the cost of the rickshaws and repay the investment.

Additionally, we have launched sustainable projects such as food gardens and olive tree planting, which contribute to long-term food security and economic stability. Through these comprehensive efforts, The Zahra Trust is dedicated to creating lasting positive change and empowering communities to thrive independently.



Water Solutions

At The Zahra Trust, access to clean water is a cornerstone of our mission to improve the health, education, and economic stability of vulnerable communities. Over the last **10 years**, The Zahra Trust has supplied clean and safe water to more than **1,826,200 beneficiaries**, addressing one of the most critical challenges faced by vulnerable populations.

In **2024 alone**, we expanded our efforts, constructing **153 water wells in Pakistan**, and **21 Water Wells in Afghanistan** ensuring that families and communities in underserved areas have access to reliable and sustainable water sources.



Comprehensive Water Initiatives:

Our work encompasses a wide range of water provision projects designed to address immediate needs and create long-term solutions:

Water Wells:

We construct and maintain electric and solar-powered water wells, ensuring reliable access to clean water for remote communities. These wells not only provide a steady supply of water but also alleviate the burden on women and children who often spend hours fetching water from distant sources.

Water Filtration Plants:

Our filtration plants purify contaminated water, ensuring it is safe for consumption and significantly reducing the risk of waterborne diseases.

Desalination Plants:

In areas where fresh water is scarce, we are investing in desalination plants to convert seawater into potable water, expanding access to clean water in coastal regions.

Impact on Health and Well-Being

Access to clean water directly impacts community health, reducing the prevalence of waterborne diseases by up to 80%, as noted by the World Health Organisation. By improving water quality, we are also addressing child mortality rates and enabling better educational and economic opportunities for families.

Empowering Communities

Our water initiatives extend beyond infrastructure; they empower communities by fostering resilience and independence. Reliable access to clean water ensures families can focus on education, work, and personal development without the constant struggle to secure this vital resource.



Looking Ahead

The Zahra Trust remains committed to expanding our water and sanitation projects to reach even more vulnerable communities. Future initiatives include:

- Increasing the number of solar-powered water wells to provide sustainable access in underserved areas.
- Scaling up desalination plants in coastal regions to address water scarcity.
- Strengthening partnerships to ensure the maintenance and longevity of water systems.

Through these efforts, we are transforming lives, one drop at a time. Together, we can ensure that no one is left without access to this basic human right, creating healthier, more resilient communities for generations to come.



For Nasir, a 32-year-old resident of Baltistan, the daily struggle for water was a constant reminder of the hardships his community faced. For over a decade, he and his neighbors endured severe water scarcity, relying on a single tap shared by 60 households. Long queues, exhausting walks to the riverbank, and an endless fight for clean drinking water defined their lives. This relentless struggle drained their time, energy, and well-being.

The Zahra Trust brought a much-needed change in November 2024. Over ten days, the Trust installed a water well equipped with modern water motors, pipes, and infrastructure to ensure every resident had round-the-clock access to clean and safe water. This initiative didn't just provide water, it transformed lives.

The impact was immediate and profound. Children, who once spent hours collecting water, now have time to focus on their education, play, and personal development. Women and elders, freed from the grueling task of fetching water, can devote their energy to household and community activities. With improved access to water for drinking, bathing, and cleaning, the entire village has seen an enhancement in hygiene and health.

The Zahra Trust's efforts in Taqi Chowk go beyond just providing water; they exemplify the strength of compassion and sustainable solutions. By tackling a basic necessity, this program has enabled a village to flourish, transforming a persistent challenge into a chance for growth and harmony.

Housing and Shelter

Financial hardship compounded her struggles, leaving her with little hope of improving their living conditions. Yet, amidst these challenges, Siham's determination and the support of compassionate individuals brought her dream of a safe home to life.

Siham's journey started with a heartfelt request for assistance. After the loss of her husband, she depended on the generosity of compassionate individuals to help her through tough times. One of these supporters was The Zahra Trust, which played a crucial role in helping her realise her dream of reconstructing her home.



In the last year, and with the generosity of our donors, The Zahra Trust was able to deliver **17 rickshaws** to vulnerable individuals. The impact of the Rickshaw Microfinancing Scheme goes far beyond financial assistance. It restores autonomy, dignity, and a sense of pride to those who participate. For individuals who once considered owning a business unattainable, this initiative provides the tools to build their own livelihoods. No longer reliant on handouts or charity, they can work to support themselves and their families, fostering personal confidence and self-worth.

Um Fatima's Journey: How we helped a widow build stabality

Um Fatima's story is one of strength and empowerment, showing perseverance in the face of unimaginable hardship. After losing her husband, she was left to care for her four daughters with no stable source of income.

Coming from a poor family and having little formal education, her only means of survival was selling paper tissues and popular foods on the streets. Each day was a struggle, but her determination never wavered as she worked tirelessly to ensure her daughters had the bare essentials. Still, the constant weight of poverty and uncertainty loomed, leaving her to wonder if stability would ever be within reach.

Um Fatima's business took a meaningful turn when The Zahra Trust stepped in with an initiative designed to empower widows and foster financial independence. Recognising Um Fatima's tenacity and resourcefulness, the Trust proposed a plan to provide her with the tools she needed to transform her livelihood. They collaborated with community members to establish a permanent, metal kiosk outfitted with shelves—a space where Um Fatima could safely sell her goods without the challenges of street vending. With the trust's supervision, Um Fatima received the support and tools she needed to transition from a struggling street vendor to a small business owner.

Nestled behind our **mowkeb at Pole 470**, in the Haidariya area between Najaf and Karbala, our orphan village is more than just a building—it is a sanctuary of care, empowerment, and hope. For years, this comprehensive facility has been at the heart of our efforts to support orphans, widows, and vulnerable children, offering a safe haven and life-changing opportunities.

Year-Round Support for Vulnerable Communities

The orphan village provides essential services that go beyond immediate relief, focusing on long-term development and empowerment:



Housing and Nourishment:

A secure and nurturing environment where vulnerable families and individuals can rebuild their lives.

Education and Skills Training:

Empowering orphans and widows with tools to achieve self-reliance and brighter futures.

Aid Distribution:

Functioning as a year-round hub to deliver food, clothing, and essential supplies to vulnerable populations.

This facility serves as a cornerstone of our mission, addressing the diverse needs of those in hardship while fostering dignity, resilience, and growth.

Supporting Pilgrims During Arbaeen

During the Arbaeen pilgrimage, the orphan village transforms into a centre of hospitality, serving pilgrims travelling between Najaf and Karbala. We provide:

Nutritious Meals:

This year we provided full-day food services, including 253,570 drinks, 91,000 meals, and 43,000 snacks.

Comfort Facilities:

Spaces for sleeping, air-conditioned rooms, and western toilet facilities.

Holistic Support:

Medical aid, massage guns, free books, and spaces for prayer, reflection, and spiritual growth.

Our goal is to create a welcoming environment for pilgrims, supporting their spiritual journey with care and comfort.

Looking Ahead

As we continue to develop the orphan village, our vision remains focused on enhancing its capacity and expanding its services. With ongoing initiatives and future projects, the facility will serve as a vital resource for vulnerable communities, ensuring that our mission of fostering positive change and development remains steadfast.

Muharram & Safar

The months of Muharram and Safar hold profound significance in Islamic history, commemorating the timeless principles of justice, sacrifice, and humanity epitomised by Hussain ibn Ali (as). At The Zahra Trust, we draw inspiration from these values to deliver impactful humanitarian aid during this sacred period, addressing the urgent needs of vulnerable communities while fostering spiritual growth worldwide.

Our Impact

Through the Muharram and Safar Campaign, **359,644 beneficiaries** were served, reflecting the scale and depth of our efforts to address critical needs:

Water Aid: Providing access to clean, safe drinking water in areas facing acute scarcity.

Humanitarian Assistance: Addressing hunger and food insecurity through the distribution of nutritious meals, essential supplies, and financial support to uplift those in vulnerable circumstances.

Education and Skills Development: Offering remedial courses, religious education, and school supplies for vulnerable students. Vocational training programs, including nursing, horticulture, and beauty courses for widows, along with construction and equipping schools with resources like smartboards and snacks for students.

Healthcare and Medical Aid: Supporting treatments for cancer, cataract surgeries, and medical debt, as well as specialised care for burns, leukemia, and post-accident surgeries. Medical clinics and pharmacies were also established.

Basic Needs and Livelihood Support: Distributing food aid, flour, and setting up a bakery to foster self-sustainability. Housing assistance was provided through home construction and rent aid for orphaned families and widows, alongside small business support via kiosks and sewing machines.

Emergency and Seasonal Aid: Assisting disaster-affected regions like Yemen and Afghanistan and supporting Arbaeen and Ashra Zeinabiyya activities, including public benefit structures.

Infrastructure and Long-Term Impact:

Constructing housing units and multi-service buildings in regions like Sar-e-Pol and Karbala, as well as establishing a desalination system in Gaza and a medical clinic in Kabul.


In 2024, we delivered over 1.8 million meals throughout the year, addressing hunger and malnutrition among vulnerable populations globally.







